## THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

February 11, 2018

**Psalm: I turn to you, Lord in time of trouble and you fill me with the joy of salvation.  
Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46; 1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1; Mark 1:40-45**

*We need to trust in the mercy of a forgiving God who assures us that our sins are forgiven and that we are clean. We are forgiven and made spiritually clean from the spiritual leprosy of sin when we repent of our sins. This is because God is a God of love who waits patiently for us. No matter how many sins we have committed or how badly we have behaved, God forgives us. The only condition required of us is we ask for forgiveness with a penitent heart. We need only kneel before Him and ask Him, “Lord, if You will, You can make me clean.” We are sure to hear His words of absolution, “Your sins are forgiven, you are absolved” spoken in the sacrament of reconciliation. We need to tear down the walls that separate us from others and build bridges of loving relationships. Jesus calls every one of us to demolish the walls that separate us from each other and to welcome the outcasts and the untouchables of society. These include homosexuals, AIDS victims, alcoholics, drug addicts and other, marginalized groups such as the divorced, unmarried single mothers, migrant workers and the mentally ill. God’s loving hand must reach out to them through us. Jesus wants us to touch their lives. Let us pass beyond the narrow circles of our friends and peers and try to relate to those who may be outside the bounds of propriety. Let us re-examine the barriers we have created and approach God with a heart that is ready to welcome the outcasts in our society.*

### FAITH BOOK

***From today's Gospel reading:***

Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out His hand, touched the leper and said to him, "I will do it. Be made clean."

***Reflection:***

When Mark describes Jesus healing the man, He uses a word that literally means a snorting kind of anger (verse 43.) The anger wasn't directed at the leper, but at the man's debilitating disease. Anger is a passion that may move us to act against injustice leveled against those without a voice or rights. When we observe an injustice, see the innocent oppressed, a righteous anger should stir us to do something about it.

***So we ask ourselves:***

- 1) What injustice do we observe that stirs us to anger?
- 2) How shall we respond to what so moves us?

### SOCIAL MINISTRIES CORNER

*Catholic Social Justice Teachings*

**Care for Creation:** Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. "The Lord God then took the man and settled him in the garden of Eden, to cultivate and care for it." (Gen 2:15) From the beginning, humans have been charged with care for this earth, not just for their own good, but for the good of all creation and future generations. The environment is God's gift to everyone, and in our use of it we have a responsibility towards the poor, towards future generations and towards humanity as a whole... Our duties towards the environment are linked to our duties towards the human person, considered in himself and in relations to others. It would be wrong to uphold one set of duties while trampling on the other. (Pope Benedict, *Charity in Truth*)

**Current issue:** Does the link between how we treat every person and how we treat our environment make sense to you? What can you do to protect the life and rights of both?
