# THE TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME September 30, 2018

Psalm: The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart. Numbers 11:25-29; James 5:1-6; Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

We need to avoid conduct that can lead to scandal. We give scandal and become stumbling blocks to others when we are unkind or unjust in our treatment of them; when we reject them because of their weakness; faults or sins, when we humiliate them by hurting their pride and damaging their self-image; and when we become judgmental of those who are still struggling to reach a level of commitment that we feel is too low to be useful. On the other hand, we become good role models when we support and guide others in moments of doubt when we increase other people's self-confidence by accepting them as they are and enabling them to discover their hidden talents and when we forgive them and listen to them with patience. Let us try to learn and practice the virtue of Christian tolerance in our interfaith and ecumenical endeavors by remaining true to our conscience and beliefs, respecting the differences we encounter, working together on projects of common interest, affirming what is good in the other person's position, even when we disagree on certain things and allowing the light of Christ to shine through our loving words and deeds. We also hear the strong warning of Jesus against giving scandal, especially to innocent children, vulnerable members of the community and beginners in the Faith. Jesus warned the Apostles, and us, that, just as a doctor might remove by surgery a limb or some part of the body to preserve the life of the whole body, so we must be ready to part with anything that causes us or others to sin and which leads to spiritual death.

#### Saint Francis of Assisi - October 4

Francis was born (Giovanni di Bernardone) either in 1181 or 1182 and died in 1226. He founded the Franciscans in 1209, received the Stigmata in 1224 and was canonized in 1228. He is known as the patron of Italy, Catholic Action, and ecologists. Francis is perhaps one of the most well- known and best loved saints in the Catholic Calendar. He is well known for the Prayer of St. Francis written by one of his later followers, his care for animals, and for his love affair with "Lady Poverty" which was the grounding for his community's service and spirituality.
