SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Luke the Evangelist – October 18

Saint Luke was the only Gentile to have written books in the Bible. He was the writer of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and his writings have been proven to be historically accurate. Unlike with the Jewish writers, women have an important place in Luke's gospel. Luke wrote about the women who accompanied Jesus, such as Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Susanna, and Martha and Mary and "many other women who used their own resources to help Jesus and His disciples" (8:1). In addition, it is only in the gospel of Luke that the story of Mary's Annunciation, her visit to Elizabeth, the Magnificat, the Presentation and Jesus' remaining in Jerusalem are told. In addition, Saint Luke was a physician who most likely tended to the injuries that Saint Paul suffered as he evangelized the Western Roman Empire.
