# 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 18, 2021- Jeremiah 23:1-6; Ephesians 2:13-18; Mark 6:30-34

### Finding energy to do what we're called to do- Good News Reflection

Everyone in ministry feels overwhelmed by their calling from time to time. Whether it's the ministry of raising children, or caring for an elderly spouse or parent, or working a job in a way that reveals Christ, or volunteering at a church or pastoring a parish, it's necessary to take time out for ourselves -- a vacation, a holiday -- for nourishment and rest and recuperation. Jesus says so in this Sunday's Gospel reading.

If we don't obey this commandment, we become cranky. We make selfish or poor decisions. We become like the evil shepherds of the first reading, who misled and scattered those whom they were called to serve. Why? Because we become vulnerable to temptations when we try to give what we do not have.

It takes energy to reveal God's love. It takes energy to remain enthusiastic in serving others. But how can we get recharged with new energy if we don't take time to sit still, rest, and pray? How can we care about others when we don't take good care of ourselves? Jesus lives within us, but before we can give him to others, we must first let him give himself to us.

Daily we encounter people who are like sheep without a shepherd; they are seeking Jesus whether they realize it or not. They want the unconditional love that he has to give. They want the healing and peace that he offers. He wants to help them, but if we who are his hands and feet and voice are too weak and worn out from our hardships, what then?

We need to go to a deserted place with Jesus and rest awhile in his nourishing love. If we go away on a retreat or vacation and come back to our work and ministries still cranky (i.e., if the people we shepherd wish we'd go take a longer trip), we haven't rested enough. We've cut short the restoration process. Never-mind the pile-up of work. Jesus is inviting us to "Come away by yourself and rest awhile longer with Me until you become more like Me."



Thank you Lord, because when my strength declines, You call me to rest, strengthen me in my weakness and walk ahead of me, working Your plan of salvation. Amen.

**BAPTISMAL REQUIREMENTS** You can also find the baptismal requirements at

https://stmarysgreensboro.org/sacrements/

(newborns-6 years of age)

.. **REGISTRATION**. The family must be registered -<u>form on file</u>- in St. Mary's <u>for no less than 2 months</u> before the Baptism takes place.

- If parents are registered somewhere else, they must present a Letter of Permission from their parish priest in order for the child to be baptized here.
- PRE-BAPTISMAL TALK. The Parents and godparents (sponsors) must have attended the pre-baptismal talk before the date of baptism.
- **SPONSORS**. Sponsors must be registered at a Catholic Parish, be practicing Catholics, and must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation. If any of the Sponsors are living together as a couple, he/she must have been married in the Roman Catholic Church.
- **DOCUMENTS.** Bring **COPIES** of:

- Child's Birth Certificate
- Sponsor's Sacramental Certificates
  - Baptism, First Communion & Confirmation (or Marriage in case he/she is living with a significant other)

#### **IMPORTANT.... DOCUMENT REQUESTS** TO ST. MARY'S

Do you need a Sponsor Certificate/letter for either Baptism or Confirmation, a letter for Immigration, Membership, any type of Recommendation letter, or document? We must have your registration/census ON FILE for at least 2 months prior to your request.

## Message From Our Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

In St. John's Gospel Passion Narrative, we hear in the dialogue between Jesus and Pontius Pilate, the reason why Jesus came, "to testify to the truth." Pilate's response is well known to us, "What is truth?" In our nation there is a crisis concerning this very question, "What is Truth?" As Catholic Christians we have come to know and believe that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. If Christ is our truth and the way and life, we are to live within his truth then we need to reflect not on "What is the Truth?", but what is Christ's truth and how his truth can lead us in our day? What we hear time and again is that Jesus did not come to condemn the world, but to save it. Jesus came as the visible image of the invisible God who is love. We have heard that Jesus proclaimed a Kingdom of mercy, justice, peace and compassion especially to the poor, the sick, the sinner, and the oppressed. Jesus gathered around him, disciples to continue his mission which centered on forgiveness of sins and reconciliation. Jesus, at the Last Supper gave of himself, his body, blood, soul and divinity to strengthen us his disciples to go forth and proclaim the Good News. Jesus on the Cross chose for us the pathway of redemption and healing. Jesus in the Resurrection announced that sin, death and darkness would be no more for those who believed in him. This is the truth of Jesus Christ? How does our living out Christ's truth affect the way we think and act today? If we choose to live Christ's truth as the ultimate guide and expression for people of faith, hope and love in our day then we choose to no longer say, "What is the truth?" like Pontius Pilate. We choose to remember that Christ's truth sheds light in the darkness. We choose to confront lies and the corruption that comes from lies. When you or I say that we will choose Christ's truth above all we open ourselves to being set free. Free to cast aside fear and hatred, suspicion and conspiracy whispering. With Christ's truth comes the freedom to have our eyes open, not to what we want the truth to be, but to how God sees. Christ's truth in our day should remind us that his truth does not lead to violence but understanding and reconciliation. His truth does not lead to discrimination, prejudice and racism. His truth does not lead us into violence, elitism, entitlement, and injustice. His truth does not lead us into hatred, and rage. His truth above all does not lead to lies and evil intent. His truth above all leads to the ways of peace making, dialogue, reconciliation and the building of God's kingdom here and now. In short brothers and sisters who strive to live the truth of Christ in our day, we have to ask not "what is Truth?" but whose truth do we listen to and act upon? Whose truth forms the bedrock of our responses and decision making? Whose truth do we discern that which is right, holy and just that cannot be divorced from our moral decision making? Whose truth will encourage us to embrace the fullness of our dignity, integrity and humanity? Whose Truth...?
